Women's Care Center

Mission Statement: Meeting needs and sharing Christ with women who are struggling with addictive behaviors, life issues and other crisis situations.

Purpose

The Women's Care Center is a 6 to 12 month residential recovery program offering a safe and loving environment to respond to the spiritual, emotional and physical needs of women who want help with their addictions and poor life choices through counseling, Bible study, life skill instruction and one on one mentoring.

Program Details

The Women's Residence program is highly structured to ensure a stable and healthy environment where women are given the resources and tools they need to help them resolve the issues that brought them to this place in their lives. We seek to glorify God, while providing hope, restoration and transformation for disadvantaged women.

Our program consists of 6 phases and can be completed in 6 to 12 months. Each month, the resident's progress is reviewed prior to advancing to the next phase. Residents participate in approximately 32 hours of class time each week. These classes include Bible studies, 12 step chemical dependency class, relapse prevention, finances, abuse recovery, healthy relationships, arts & crafts and various life skills classes. Counseling is provided to help women work through their past for long term success.



Central to our program is the principle of personal responsibility which is instilled through everything they will do. Daily household chores and service work also play a key roll in growth and accountability.

Upon completion of the phase work, women obtain employment and begin to transition back into society while living at our center to maintain accountability and spiritual growth preparing to exit the program. After a lady exits, they are encouraged to continue with accountability through our After Care program if they remain local or though a solid church if they move away from our area.

Facilities

The Women's Care Center has eight bedrooms and can accommodate 12 women. The comfortable home has office space, an apartment for a live-in resident manager, a commercial kitchen, a laundry facility and living and dining rooms that are used a classroom space on a daily basis. A spacious Florida room is home to exercise equipment for resident use.

History

The Women's Care Center opened in 1989 to provide shelter for displaced women and their children. The program has since shifted focus to women without children in their care so that they may focus on recovery and growth and prepare to become the women that God created them to be.

Partnering Opportunities

Staff

The Women's Care Center staff consists of three positions:

- The Director oversees all operations of the Women's Care Center, its programs, facilities, staff, volunteers and residents.
- The Assistant Director aids the Director with operations of the center, its programs, facilities, volunteers and residents.
- The Resident Manager provides after hours security and safety while residing on the property.

The staff is supported by a dedicated team of volunteers who serve support the educational and mentoring components of the program.
